MATHS

For a warm up today, I would like you to go and find a cone, a cube, a cylinder, a sphere and a cuboid in your house. Then watch the 3D song to remind you of the 3D shape names. **Don't forget to hold up the correct shape when the name is called out!**

Introducing faces of 3D shapes

Watch this song about 3D shapes that can stack, slide or roll. Watch out for the rectangular prism...We call it a **cuboid.**

Stack, slide or roll?

Point to the shapes that stack. Why can they stack? Point to the shapes that slide. Why can they slide? Point to the shapes that roll. Why can they roll?

Have a go at this investigation. You have to think carefully about the different types of face your 3D shape has. Investigation
