Choose your favourite wild animal and think about its colours or special features. For example, if I was to create a tiger mask I would need to make sure I did some orange and black stripes, whiskers and pointy ears. Here are some examples to help you:



If you would like to turn the animal into a mask you could cut out the eyes instead of attaching googly eyes/drawing eyes on and you may also want to attach a lollipop stick or straw to the bottom so that you can hold it in front of your face.
