1. Use a dictionary or [this online dictionary](#) if you don't have one, to find out the meaning of the following words in the text: **loyal, stocks, frayed, poaching, poverty** and **burdensome**

2. What does the word choice **'vexatious outlaw'** tell you about the relationship between Prince John and Robin Hood?
3. Summarise in three sentences what happened in this chapter.
4. How has the author made the reader feel about a) Prince John and the Sheriff and b) Robin Hood and his men?

READING – Answers – no peeking too early!

1. loyal- staying in a firm or strong friendship
 stocks – (in this context) an instrument of punishment consisting of a heavy wooden frame with holes in which the feet, hands, or head of an offender were locked
 frayed- (in this context) unravelling at the edges from damage or wear
 poaching – (in this context) the illegal practice of trespassing on another's property to hunt or steal game without the landowner's permission
 poverty- being extremely poor
 burdensome- to be a burden or worry

2. **'vexatious outlaw'** . Explain what the words mean. Explain what Prince John might think of Robin Hood and what Robin Hood thinks of Prince John. E.g If Prince John thought him a vexatious outlaw then he thought that he was annoying him in a confusing way and making him angry as an 'outlaw' he is viewing as a criminal hiding from the authorities. . Prince John would be feeling cross at being outwitted by Robin Hood and is not able to find him. Robin Hood probably knows this and is doing it on purpose to annoy him because the Prince has treated others unfairly.
3. **3 sentences.** e.g The Sheriff of Nottingham was sent by Prince John to find Robin Hood. When the Sheriff's men found the Miller, they killed him because he would not tell where Robin was. Much the Miller's son had witnessed the whole thing and was saved by Will Scarlet, one of Robin's men.
4. **Explain what Prince John is like and how we know using evidence in the text . Explain what Robin Hood is like and how we know. Explain how the reader is made to feel.**
 - a) Prince John and the Sheriff is shown to be uncaring and evil by causing harm and death to others. They have made laws that are unfair and treat others badly. As the readers, we are made to feel like they should not succeed and not like them.
 - b) Robin Hood and his men are shown to be caring of others, when Will saves Much and takes him to join the Merry men. As the reader, we are made to feel that they are doing good even though they have not stuck to the laws. The laws are harsh and not fair so we feel sorry for those who suffer because of them.
