Reception WEEK 5 THEME: IN THE GARDEN Date: 7.05.2020

MATHS

We've been looking at time this week. We've looked at the days of the week and at the things we do during the day. What part of the day do we go to bed? Do we go to school on a Saturday?

We have also looked at how we need to do certain things in the right order. **Do we clean our teeth after we've got into bed?**

This morning I want you to watch this clip. It will show you why it is important to know the days of the week and what time it is.

Time

Have a look for a calendar in your house. Get your adult to tell you why a calendar is important for them. Parents if you could show your child, some of the appointments or important dates on your calendar, it will help your child understand the importance of knowing the day and the date.

Now children, have a hunt round for any clocks in your house. Perhaps your adult will let you take a photo of them. The clock will tell you what time you have to start something or be somewhere.

What time do you get up?

What time do you start home schooling?

What time do you go to bed?

Parents, you don't need to write the answers down. If in the next couple of days you have to do anything at a particular time, please could you talk to your child about it and refer to a clock just so they can see how important a clock is for everyday life.

LITERACY/ UNDERSTANDING OF THE WORLD

Children we have looked at the life cycle of a butterfly and yesterday we looked at the life cycle of a plant in the story of 'The Tiny Seed'. Have a go at this game, it shows the life cycle of the butterfly, plant and other living creatures.

Lifecycles

Below children, I have written a sentence for each stage of the life cycle.



It is a seed. (seed)



The seed has a root. (roots)



The seed has shoots. (shoots)



It is a little plant. (little plant)



It has a flower. (flower)



The seeds fly away. (seeds)

Today I want you to choose either the **chicken** or the **frog** or the **tree.** In your book, draw a picture for each stage and then write a sentence for each picture. Use the game to help you.

Parents, the sentences only have to be simple. The children are at different stages so choose the best option below for your child. If it's too difficult go back a stage. If it's too easy move forward a stage.

Stage 1

Some children are just beginning to use their phonetic skills when writing. If this is so, let your child label the picture with one or two words. I have put the words for my example in brackets. It is important they sound the words out.

Stage 2

Some children will need help to hold a sentence. If this is so, you will find you need to keep repeating the whole sentence but your child might be able to sound out each word independently.

Hold a sentence means the child can give a sentence and keep it in their head by themselves. They don't need an adult to keep repeating it.

Stage 3

Some children will able to hold a sentence and write it independently. If this is so, please encourage finger spaces, capital letters and full stops.

THEMED LEARNING
