**THEME: ANIMALS**

### MATHS

For today's maths activity I would like you to find an empty box, Tupperware container, hoop or anything you can throw objects into. Make yourself some number cards by ripping some pieces of paper and writing numbers from 11-20 on them. I would then like you to find some objects you can throw, you will need up to 20 of them so something like small soft toys, counters, small animal toys or if you don't have anything then scrunch up some old newspapers to make 20 balls. Once you have all your things ready, I want you to turn over the number cards and pick one randomly. Whatever number is on the card is the amount of objects you need to throw into your container. So, if you turn over a 12, you must throw 12 items into the box, count carefully as you throw them. Repeat using different number cards.



## THEMED LEARNING

Yesterday I asked you to get some masking tape ready for this activity. You will need: some paper, masking tape and some paint or coloured pens or pencils.

Today we are going to create some animal print art. Have a look at the different animal prints below and see if you can guess which animal they are from:










After looking at the prints I would like you to try and create an animal print of your own. To do this you (and an adult helper) need to place the masking tape in patterns on the paper. So, if you are doing giraffe print then the masking tape would need to overlap and create sections that looks like the shapes of giraffe print, if you have chosen tiger or zebra then the tape will need to be placed in straight-ish lines to create the look of stripes. Once you have placed the masking tape on I want you to paint the sections that aren't covered in tape. Leave to dry and when you peel off the tape you should have something that looks like your own animal print. Here are some examples of how to place the tape to help you:





You could even invent your own imaginary colourful animal print by doing something like this:
