Reception WEEK 9

THEME: ANIMALS

Date: 08.06.2020

MATHS

Today we are going to continue practicing our numbers but will also be concentrating on making sure we are counting accurately. When we are counting out large quantities of items it's important to do it as accurately as possible and one of the ways to do this is by lining objects up and counting them by pointing or touching from left to right, that way you are unlikely to miss any.

Today I would like you to get a large sheet of paper or put two A4 pieces of paper together, I would then like you to write numbers 11 to 20 down the left side (adults, try to encourage them to space them out as they will have to place objects next to the numbers). Once you have written the numbers, I would like you to find something in the house to use for counting, it could be coins, buttons, counters, pasta, anything you have at least 20 of. I would then like you to place the correct amount of items next to each of the numbers you have written, so next to 11, place 11 objects. Place them in a straight line and only count them once you have put them down on the paper. Go back and count them to check you have the correct amount by pointing at them left to right and then move onto the next number.

LITERACY, COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

As we discussed last week, letters have both names and sounds. I want you to continue practising both the letter names and sounds regularly so here is an alphabet song for you to become familiar with the letter names <u>ABC</u> <u>Song</u>

Now I want you to think back to our story 'Monkey Puzzle'. The poor monkey couldn't find his mummy in the story, sometimes when animals are lost their owners make 'Lost Posters' to help find them again. Below are some examples of 'Lost Posters'. Have a look at them and discuss with an adult what you will need to put on your lost poster (a picture of the animal, name, description). I would then like you to try and create your own Lost Poster for monkeys mummy.
