Reception WEEK 6 Date: 18.06.2020 THEME: ANIMALS

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MATHS

Warm up for today: Count up to 20 and then start at 20 and count back to 0. Use a number line if you need to. number line to 20

Today, we are going to start looking at the language that will show us the position we are in and the direction we need to go. These are very important words that will help you find something or go somewhere. Some of these words are over, under, in between, behind, in front of, next to and around. Get a chair and see if you can show these positions.

Which one did you find difficult to do with one chair? Why? That's right; you need 2 chairs to go in between. Ok, I would like you to watch this story about a hen called Rosie and a Fox. Listen out for all those direction words. Rosie's Walk

Now can you remember the words used to show the directions, Rosie took on her walk? I would like you to watch Rosie's Walk again but this time.....turn the sound off and you say where Rosie is going. Parents, words to watch for are across, around, over, past, through, under, in.

Well done, if you remembered them all.
