Reception WEEK 6 THEME: ANIMALS Date: 19.06.2020

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MATHS

Warm up for today: See if you can answer these 1 more and 1 less questions. Don't forget to use a number line if you need to.

number line to 20

What is 1 less than 9? What is 1 more than 1? What is 1 less than 3?

What is 1 more than 16? What is 1 more than 12? What is 1 less than 2?

Is this right or wrong? 7 is 1 less than 6. How do you know the answer?

Is this right or wrong? 17 is 1 more than 18. How do you know the answer?

Parents, the last 2 questions are reasoning ones. The children have to give a reason for why they think the answer. The answers can be as simple as because 7 is 1 more than 6 or 7 comes after 6. If you child struggles with these. Don't worry, model the answer for them. They need to get used to hearing these kind of questions and be given the opportunity to verbalise their thinking.

Yesterday, you watched Rosie's walk. Today I have a clip that will give you the opportunity to read the book yourself. **Parents if you could turn off the volume so the children read the book themselves.**
