MATHS- Fractions

45 minutes

Warm up- Lets practise some mental maths, remember you should be able to do these in your head without using any equipment to help you.

$3 + 5 =$ $7 + 9 =$ $3 + 7 =$ $2 + 2 + 3 =$ $7 + 8 =$ $9 + 6 =$

OR

$13 + 12 =$ $7 \times 5 =$ $18 \div 2 =$ $15 + 13 + 2 =$ $17 - 9 =$ $26 - 12 - 3 =$

Remind yourself about fractions by visiting BBC Bitesize – What are fractions? Complete the activity and answer the questions.

Today you are going to be finding halves and quarters of numbers.

To begin with you can use objects to help you and then move on to drawing 2 or 4 circles and sharing the number out equally by drawing dots.

If you are finding half draw 2 circles and share the number out equally, then choose one group and count how many dots are inside that group. If you are finding a quarter draw 4 circles and share the number out equally, then choose one group and count how many dots are inside that group.

Complete these...

$\frac{1}{2}$ of 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ of 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ of 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ of 14 $\frac{1}{2}$ of 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ of 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ of 24

If Tom has 18 cakes and he eats half. How many are left?

If Greg has some pencils, half of them are 6 red pencils. How many does he have altogether?

Sarah has 30 toy cars and she donates half to charity, how many has she got left?

If half of a piece of string is 7cms, how long is the whole piece of string?

Using the number 16 and 8, can you write your own word problem?

If $\frac{1}{2}$ of a tree height is 8cms, what is the height of $\frac{2}{4}$ of the tree?

Look on pages 3 and 4 of the very crowded beach.

Write sentences to describe different things that you can see on this page.

Include, capital letters, full stops, exclamation marks, adjectives, adverbs and nouns.

For example:

There is a vicious, orange crab nipping angrily at a man’s toe.

Aim to write five sentences- don’t forget to concentrate on your handwriting too!

Find someone at home to play hangman with you using your spellings and your common exception words.

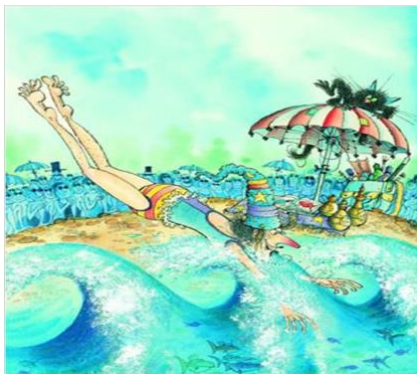
