**MATHS- Multiplication and Division**

**45 minutes**

Warm up- Using the internet visit 'mathsfactor.com' – click onto games and fun and then click onto games centres. There are lots of games to choose from, try an area that you find tricky! Take advantage of this website as its only free until 5th July.

Use small objects from around the house, whatever your objects are, use 10 – share these objects into equal groups (ensure your child understands what equal groups means) practise with different amounts.

How many objects are in your equal groups?

Use YouTube – watch 'How to share equally – Introduction to Division'

Can you now practise these below, I would like you to draw the groups and draw dots to show the objects that you are sharing. You can do it practically with objects first.

Share 6 between 2 groups

Share 15 between 3 groups

Share 14 between 2 groups

Share 12 between 4 groups

Share 16 between 2 groups

Eva has shown these equal groups, but she has made a mistake, draw the cubes again to show how she has got it wrong.




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What else do we need to show 'five 3's'?
