

How can I use this with my children?

Set up a fun Easter egg hunt in your home, garden or party venue for children to play as a fun activity or party game.

How does this help my children's learning?

This game involves recognising shape, colour and pattern and using problem solving skills to find the hidden eggs.

Ideas for further learning:

For an extra challenge, you could draw a few eggs to hide around the garden as red herrings too.



Easter Egg Hunt Game

You will need:

Easter Egg Hunt Answer Sheets Hidden Egg Printouts Easter Egg Hunt Sign Posts (optional) scissors (optional) sticky tack or sticky tape pens or pencils prize (optional)



Set Up:

- 1. Print off an Egg Hunt Answer Sheet for each player or team.
- 2. Print off and cut around a set of Hidden Egg Printouts. You may wish to print or stick onto card, laminate or put them in a plastic wallet to make them a little more durable, especially if you're playing outside.
- 3. Hide the eggs around your chosen area. Depending on the age and ability of the children, you can make this as easy or as tricky as desired, though you will need to ensure that the eggs can be found in a safe space. Why not let the pattern peep out from behind places? You may wish to print off and use the Easter Egg Hunt Sign Posts to help guide the children to find eggs too.

How to play:

- 1. Let your players know where the playing area is and which areas are out of bounds.
- 2. When instructed to start, players search for eggs around the area and tick off each pattern on their Answer Sheet when they find the matching egg.
- 3. The first player or team to tick off all the eggs on their Answer Sheet wins the game!



Tips and alternatives to try:

- You could write secret numbers or words on the back of each Hidden Egg Print-Out for the players to write on their Answer Sheet - this ensures that they've definitely found each egg!
- 2. Making a hole in an Egg Print-Out and threading some ribbon through means you could hang it in different and interesting places, such as trees or bannisters.
- 3. You might choose to let children play alone or in teams
- 4. Why not leave little prizes near each eggs for an extra treat in the treasure hunt?
- 5. Using a timer can present a fun extra challenge why not see how quickly they can find all the eggs or how many they can find within a certain time limit?

Tick the box next to the egg when you find where it is hidden.




























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
