Who teaches this subject?	The PHSE curriculum is delivered by class teachers. Children are taught in class groups from Foundation stage to Year 6 (unless it is appropriate to have a different group). Teaching Assistants will support individual children and larger groups, where directed by the class teacher.
What can the children expect?	<ul> <li>Progression of knowledge and understanding building on prior learning</li> <li>Use of a high -quality resource recommended by experts to support structure and lesson content: Jigsaw ©</li> <li>Opportunities for discussion about ideas</li> <li>Time to explain their thinking with a partner, group, class or adult.</li> <li>Opportunity to make links with previous learning</li> <li>A programme of learning matched to the most recent guidance and statutory requirements.</li> </ul>
How is it taught?	<ul> <li>Teachers plan lessons following the school long and medium-term plan units using the Jigsaw © resources guidance.</li> <li>They will use their professional judgement to plan suitable learning activities that match the needs of the children in the class. Teachers will adapt a flexible approach to ensure that the pace of lessons is appropriate for all learners.</li> <li>In PHSE, they may use a variety of techniques alongside those already part of quality–first teaching: <ul> <li>'Calm me' technique to focus on stillness and mindfulness</li> <li>'Paws' pause to stop and reflect technique</li> <li>Discussion about scenarios</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
How is it assessed?	Teachers will make use of a variety of assessment opportunities: effective questioning techniques and use the REST (resilience assessment), visited termly.
