
MATHS

This week we are going to be looking at money. We have briefly done this in class however I want to see if you can remember all of the coins. If you have a piggy bank you could look in then this would be useful but ask a grown up first. If not see if there are any coins in your house. Try to find one of each, so you will need: 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p, £1 and £2. If you haven't got all of the coins in the house then search online for pictures of each one. Describe the shape and colour of each, which are bigger and which are smaller? Which ones are worth more? Which is worth less? Ask a grown up to help you put them in order of which one is the least amount of money to which one is the most amount of money. Once you have done this then get some paper and pencil and place the coin under the paper, do a coin rubbing of each side so you can study the patters. Write the coin value next to your rubbings, don't forget when we are writing or talking about money we need to add the 'p' and '£' signs.
