MATHS

Today I would like you to create your own shop. Collect some items from around the house that you could sell or if you have a toy shop then you could use this. Make some labels using stickers or by writing on small pieces of paper and attaching or placing them next to the items for sale. Make sure the items cost the exact amount of the coins we looked at yesterday, so some items might cost 1p, some might cost 5p, 10p etc. Once your shop is set up then I would like you to be the shop keeper, use the coins you found yesterday and give them to whoever you are playing with (they will be the customer). Invite them to buy some items from your shop, when they have chosen an item, identify how much it costs and ask them for the correct amount of money, Once you have done this, swap roles so that you are the customer.
