MATHS

I would like us to continue learning about coins today, here is an online game which will help you practise your knowledge of coins: <u>Topmarks- Coin Games</u>. THEMED LEARNING

In the story, the Lion is described at the 'Head of the pack', lions are also often referred to as the 'king of the jungle'. Why do you think this is?

Some animals like the Lion eat meat, these animals are called **Carnivores**, other animals such as the

mouse, like to eat other things like leaves, berries and nuts, these animals are called **herbivores**. Try to remember these two words and what they mean. Here is a video which describes the two in a little more detail https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zwfd2p3.

In the video clip there were a lot of woodland animals shown. We have been learning a lot about wild animals and animals that live in the jungle and savannah. By doing a little research can you make a list of which wild animals are 'Herbivores' and which wild animals are 'Carnivores'. I have created a table below which you might like to use, you can either write or draw the animal in the correct column.
